

Pastor's Musings

.Spiritual but not Religious

I hadn't intended to continue the series of articles on spirituality beyond the three previous months, but a conversation with a well-meaning, sincere young person recently prompted me to make one last contribution on the topic (for the moment, at least.) This conversation involved the young person expressing their lack of interest in "organized religion" but at the same time declaring that they are "spiritual but not religious." I know they were expecting me to rush to the defense of tradition, religion and whatever it is they thought I represented, but instead, I simply replied, "great! Then I'll see you in church on Sunday!"

For one thing, if you know anything about the way the church works, there's no way the adjective "organized" can accurately be used to describe it! But, more seriously, this distinction between spirituality and religiosity, while I find it a bit disingenuous, is one for which I have some sympathy.

Most people would regard me, in my role as pastor at Venice Presbyterian, as a "religious leader" and, so far as I perform duties that maintain certain traditions and historical rituals, they are probably right. However, I would rather see my role as that of "leader of a spiritual community." This distinction is an important one.

Religion is, first and foremost, about a series of rules and regulations, developed by its adherents to define the norms of life within that particular religious "club." These rules are the terms of membership of that club, and quite often, when people become zealous about those rules, that can spill over into a hyper-judgmentalism towards those not in the "club." Those who turn their back on "organized religion" are effectively rejecting that kind of religious behavior.

Spirituality, on the other hand, seeks to deepen the relationship between the individual and God, and thereby to create a loving bond between them and others. Rules and regulations don't really apply because the fundamentals of spirituality are relational, not regulatory. People who become zealous about spirituality are more likely to become aware of their own brokenness and need for closer communion with God and others, than they are to beat up others who don't follow their rules.



I firmly believe that Jesus did not set out to create a religion, but to call together a spiritual community. It is my prayer that Venice Presbyterian can more and more exemplify that kind of community. If you are – or know - one of the "spiritual but not religious" people who has shied away from the church because of what you think goes on there, then I would welcome a conversation with you. I think we might have more in common than you realize.

MISSIONS How can it be November? Thanksgiving is coming, and Christmas is less than 60 days away! We will again be supporting **Haven House** with gift cards during the Christmas season, but, like last year, we will be asking for monetary donations during November-December. The donated funds will then be used to purchase the designated gift cards to be given to Haven House. Please remember the **Haven House families** this Christmas!

Those gently used socks, blankets/afghans/throws (and sleeping bags!), and those plastic bags to make mats for sleeping on the ground that you donate to community outreach? Community outreach includes the larger Butler County Community, not just our own VPC Pantry and RAMM. Community Meal Center at Zion Lutheran Church in Hamilton, Ohio, is just one place where those socks are handed out and you might see a braided plastic mat rolled up in a bicycle basket.

Volunteering a few hours of your time at the Community Meal Center serving food, drinks, snacks, or cleaning up is a hands-on way to help those in need. Several members of our congregation regularly volunteer there: Sharon Thompson, who hands out some of the 415 crocheted and knitted hats she and her daughter Jenny have made, and Tami Adams, who uses her nursing skills to help those with medical issues. Beth Ziepfel and the LOFT youth group have also volunteered at the Community Meal Center. In addition, Lois Beddard has crocheted warm scarves to hand out to anyone who wants one. Genevra Butterfield has also done this in the past. THANK YOU to all who have volunteered time and talents!

Haven House continues to need cleaning supplies and paper goods, RAMM appreciates donations of shampoo and deodorant, and VPC Pantry needs non-perishable food items. Beverage tabs are still being collected for Shriners.


Sharing Closet

What are we Learning this Month?

Yellow Class (Mrs. Meade) – For November, our theme is being thankful. We will work on the color brown and the letters S and T. We will also continue working on name recognition.


